#### **Task 01: Paraphrase the following passage 10 Pts.**

Corruption erodes trust, weakens democracy, hampers economic development and further exacerbates inequality, poverty, social division and the environmental crisis. Exposing corruption and holding the corrupt to account can only happen if we understand the way corruption works and the systems that enable it. Corruption can take many forms, and can include behaviors like:

- public servants demanding or taking money or favors in exchange for services,
- politicians misusing public money or granting public jobs or contracts to their sponsors, friends and families,
- corporations bribing officials to get lucrative deals

To fight corruption, we must embrace transparency which means shedding light on formal and informal rules, plans, processes and actions. Transparency helps us to hold all power to account for the common good.

#### **Task 02: Summarize the following passage 10 Pts.**

Placed under the theme “Deepening Cooperation for Shared Global Affluence,” the 19<sup>th</sup> NAM Summit, to which the Prime Minister Nadir Larbaoui is taking part as the representative of the President of the Republic Abdelmadjid Tebboune, is held this year amidst new global challenges which require a new momentum and a more efficient role of



this movement based on the principle of equality and the respect of all countries' sovereignty.

The President of the Republic stressed many times the necessity for the Non-Aligned Movement NAM to assume its historical responsibility in the current international context and to address the challenges, particularly the multiplication of the hotbeds of tension and regional and international tensions, the arms race, the worsening of the climate crisis and health crises related to the spread of epidemics, threatening the life of millions of human beings worldwide.

President Tebboune insisted on the necessity of returning to the founding objectives and principles of NAM to which Algeria remains committed, calling the movement to take on a central role to restore balance to the international relations. Algeria reaffirmed, through its Minister of Foreign Affairs and National Community Abroad Ahmed Attaf, its commitment to giving a fresh impetus to NAM's active role in the current international circumstances and to working from its position in the Security Council for the preservation of the movement's interests and promotion of its objectives and initiatives.
